THE FORGOTTEN SEASON OF EPIPHANY

For many centuries, the Catholic Church celebrated a "Christmas cycle" that typically began at the end of November and extended through the end of January. Within this liturgical cycle, there existed three distinct seasons.

The first season was "Advent" and continues to be celebrated as it has always been. The second season was "Christmastide," which included the days of Christmas from December 25 until January 6. On January 6, the feast of the Epiphany, inaugurated "Epiphanytide," a third season that ran until the beginning of the Pre-Lenten liturgy.

The End of the 40 Days of Christmas, Candlemas (i.e., the Feast of the Purification of our Lady) is another day which the modern world greatly overlooks in importance. The Feast of Candlemas, exactly 40 days after Christmas, commemorates the Blessed Virgin Mary's obedience to the Mosaic law by submitting herself to the Temple for ritual purification, as commanded in Leviticus.

The Feast of the Purification is called Candlemas for the traditional blessing and distribution of candles on that day. It is customary to bring candles from home to be blessed - at least 51% beeswax candles that one uses for devotional purposes (candles for the family altar, Advent candles, etc.) so they can be lit after dusk on All Saints' Day, during the Sacrament of Extreme Unction, and during storms and times of trouble.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY - 18th - 25th January

This year the theme 'You shall love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself' (Lk 10:27) has come from an ecumenical team from Burkina Faso. They have reflected on the familiar story of the Good Samaritan, and all are encouraged to Go and do likewise. It is a story about crossing boundaries that calls our attention to the bonds that unite the whole human family.

"Those who are touched by God's grace cannot turn in on themselves and live only for themselves; they are always on the march, always driven to go forward and to go forward together."

Again, like the Magi, whom tradition represents as representatives of diverse cultures and peoples, Christians today are "challenged to take our brothers and sisters by the hand... and move forward together." Pope Francis encouraged Christians to help one another advance "ever closer to God."
